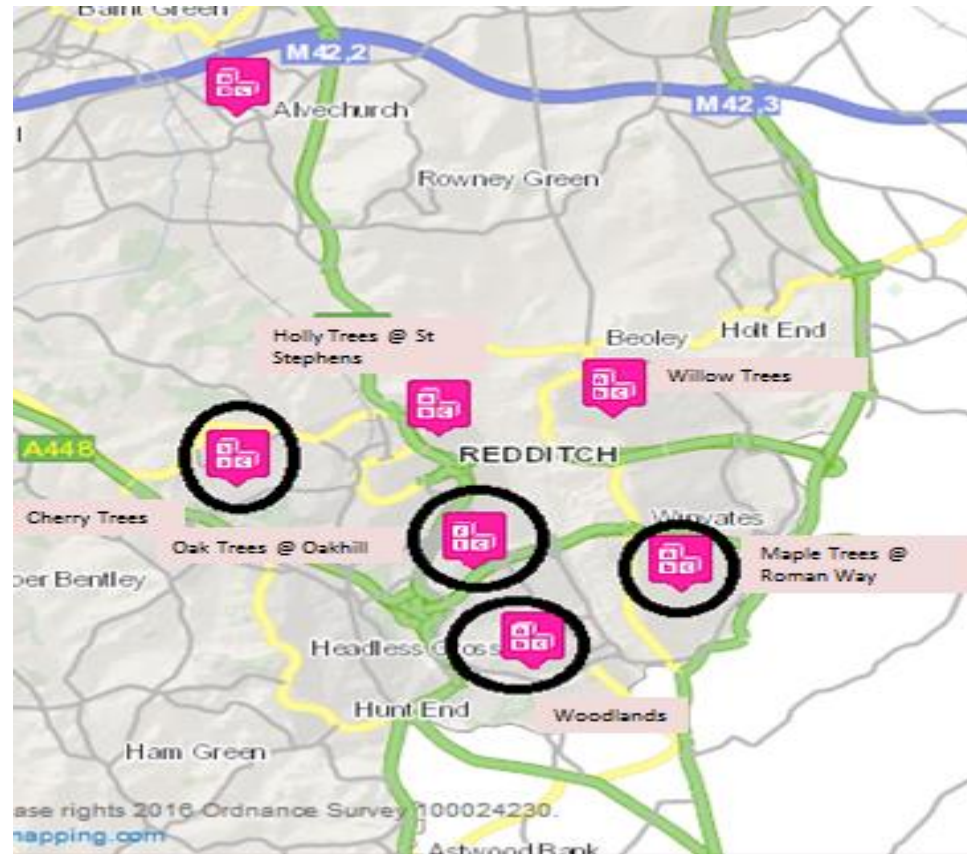

#### Centres not part of the formal consultation:

##### Holly Trees @ St Stephen's First School

This centre is currently leased to Redditch BC on a long lease and parenting and family support services will be delivered in and from this building.

##### Holly Trees @ St George's First School

This is a small outreach site and few services are delivered here due to the small amount of space available. Use by the school for funded childcare places will be formalised via the lease.



**Oak Trees @ St Luke's First School**

The existing childcare provider will continue to deliver provision as the main user of this site

**Willow Trees @ Church Hill Community Centre**

Redditch BC will continue to deliver services from this building, which is not owned by the county council
