Some web sites post documents that can be downloaded in Word format or RTF (Rich Text Format). This means that the structure and formatting of the document is compatible with Word, so it makes saving the document much easier.





The Prospectus was launched by the Secretary of State at the Skills Summit event on 13 July. There were 23 expressions of interest received wanting to establish a National Skills Academy in this first phase and a further 11 informing us they intended to develop proposals for consideration in Phase 2 for operation in 2007-08.
