1. **ACTON BEAUCHAMP** Acton Beauchamp was transferred to Herefordshire in 1897.
2. **ALCESTER** Alcester is in Warwickshire.
3. **ALDERMINSTER** Alderminster was transferred to Warwickshire in 1931. 1851 returns are at Gloucestershire Record Office, 1861-81 at Warwickshire Record Office.
4. **ALDINGTON** Aldington was a hamlet in Badsey and became a separate civil parish in 1866. For 1881 returns see Badsey.
5. **ALSTONE** Alstone is in Gloucestershire.
6. **AMBLECOTE** Amblecote ecclesiastical parish was formed in 1842 from Old Swinford and civil parish in 1866. It was in Staffordshire and is now in the West Midlands.
7. **ASHTON UNDER HILL** Ashton under Hill was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931.
8. **ASTON MAGNA** Aston Magna is in Gloucestershire.
9. **ASTON SOMERVILLE** Aston Somerville was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931.
10. **ASTON SUB EDGE** Aston Sub Edge is in Gloucestershire.
11. **BARNT GREEN** Barnt Green parish was formed from The Lickey in 1922.
12. **BECKFORD** Beckford was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931.
13. **BEWDLEY** see Ribbesford for the 1841 returns.
14. **BICKMARSH** Bickmarsh is in Warwickshire.
15. **BIRMINGHAM** Birmingham was in Warwickshire and is now in the West Midlands.
16. **BISHOPS WOOD** Bishops Wood may be included in the Hartlebury returns.
17. **BLAKEDOWN** see also Churchill & Blakedown.
18. **BLOCKLEY** Blockley was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931
19. **BORASTON** Boreston is in Shropshire.
20. **BRIMFIELD** A copy of the 1841 census returns is held by Hereford Record Office.
21. **BROADHEATH** Broadheath parish was formed in 1910 from Hallow, Wichenford and Worcester St. John in Bedwardine. For part of the 1851

returns see Cotheridge. For the 1881 returns see Cotheridge and Hallow.

22. **BROOME** Broome was transferred from Staffordshire to Worcestershire in 1844.
23. **BURFORD** Burford is in Shropshire.
24. **BURFORD & STOKE** Burford and Stoke is in Shropshire.
25. **CAKEMORE** Cakemore was transferred from Shropshire to Worcestershire in 1844.
26. **CATSHILL** Catshill parish was formed in 1844 out of Bromsgrove.
27. **CHACELEY** Chaceley was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
28. **CHARLTON** Charlton parish was formed in 1882 from Cropthorne.
29. **CHILDSWICKHAM** Childswickham was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931
30. **CHURCH ICCOMB** Church Icomb is in Gloucestershire. It was transferred from Worcestershire in 1844.
31. **CHURCHILL & BLAKEDOWN** Churchill is also known as Churchill in Halfshire.
32. **CLAINES** Claines originally covered a large part of Worcester City. There is a transcript of the 1851 census returns on the open shelves at HQq942.446501.
33. **CLENT** Clent was transferred from Staffordshire to Worcestershire in 1844.
34. **CONDERTON** Conderon is in Gloucestershire.
35. **COOKHILL** For 1841 returns see Inkberrow.
36. **COW HONEYBOURNE** Cow Honeybourne was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931
37. **CRADLEY** Cradley is in Herefordshire.
38. **CROWN EAST** For the 1841 returns see Rushwick. For the 1851 returns see Worcester, St. John.
39. **CRUTCH** For the 1841 returns see Hampton Lovett.
40. **CUTSDEAN** Cutsdean was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
41. **DAYLESFORD** Daylesford was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.

42. **DODFORD WITH GRAFTON** Dodford was formed in 1908 from Bromsgrove and Catshill.
43. **DOWLES** Dowles was transferred from Shropshire to Worcestershire in 1895.
44. **DRAKES BROUGHTON & WADBOROUGH** For the 1841 returns see Pershore Holy Cross.
45. **DUDLEY** A street index is available for the 1851 returns.
46. **EDVIN LOACH** Edvin Loach was transferred from Worcestershire to Herefordshire in 1893.
47. **EVENLODE** Evenlode was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
48. **FAR FOREST** Far Forest was formed in 1844 from Rock, Ribbesford and Stottesdon (Shrops).
49. **FINSTALL** Fininstall was formed out of Stoke Prior parish in 1868.
50. **FRANKLEY** A transcript of 1841 returns is on the open shelves at HQ942.4411.
51. **GREET** Greet is in Shropshire.
52. **GRIMLEY** The 1841 returns includes pages for Southwark St. Saviour.
53. **GUARLFORD** Guarlford was formed in 1866 out of Great Malvern and Madresfield.
54. **HALESOWEN** Halesowen was transferred from Shropshire to Worcestershire in 1844.
55. **HASBURY** Hasbury was formed from Halesowen in 1866.
56. **HAWNE** Hawne was formed from Halesowen in 1866.
57. **HEADLESS CROSS** Headless Cross was formed from Ipsley, Tardebigge and Feckenham. For the 1851 returns see Ipsley.
58. **HILL** Hill was formed from Halesowen in 1866
59. **HINTON ON THE GREEN** Hinton on the Green was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931.
60. **HOLLY BUSH** Holy Bush was formed from Berrow, Castlemorton, Eastnor and Ledbury in 1912
61. **HUNNINGTON** Hunnington was formed from Halesowen.
62. **ILLEY** Illey was formed from Halesowen in 1866.

63. **IPSLEY** Ipsley was transferred from Warwickshire to Worcestershire in 1931.
64. **KEMERTON** Kemerton was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931.
65. **KINGS NORTON** Kings Norton was transferred to Birmingham in 1911. At one time it included Moseley, Balsall Heath, Kings Health, Stirchley, Cotteridge and West Heath.
66. **KINGSWINFORD** Kingswinford was in Staffordshire and is now in West Midlands.
67. **LANGLEY** Langley was formed from Halesowen in 1846.
68. **LAPAL** Lapal was formed from Halesowen in 1866.
69. **LICKEY** Lickey was formed from portions of Bromsgrove and Kings Norton in 1856
70. **LITTLE HEREFORD** Little Hereford is in Herefordshire.
71. **LITTLE KYRE** For 1851 returns see Stoke Bliss.
72. **LITTLE WASHBOURNE** Little Washbourne is in Gloucestershire.
73. **LUTLEY** Lutley Civil Parish was formed from Halesowen in 1866.
74. **LYE** Lye was formed from Old Swinford in 1843.
75. **MALVERN LINK** For 1871 returns see Leigh.
76. **MALVERN WELLS** Malvern Wells was formed in 1836 from Hanley Castle. For 1851, 1871 and 1881 returns see Hanley Castle.
77. **MARLBOROUGH** This is also known as Marlborough in the Vines. It is part of Droitwich.
78. **MATHON** Mathon Rural (the part not in Malvern) was transferred to Herefordshire in 1897. Mathon Urban (the part in Malvern) was added to part of Cradley and renamed West Malvern.
79. **NASH** Nash is in Shropshire.
80. **NETHERTON** This is the Netherton near Elmley Castle, not the one near Dudley.
81. **NEWBOLD ON STOUR** Newbold on Stour is in Warwickshire.
82. **NORTHFIELD** Northfield was transferred from Worcestershire to Birmingham in 1911.
83. **NORTH CLAINES** North Claines was a civil parish created in 1885 from the part of Claines not in Worcester County Borough.
84. **NORTH HALLOW** North Hallow was a civil parish created from part of Hallow Civil

Parish not in Worcester County Borough.

85. **OLDBERROW** Oldberrow was transferred from Worcestershire to Warwickshire in 1896.
86. **OLDBURY** Oldbury was formed in 1841 from Halesowen. It was transferred from Shropshire to Worcestershire in 1844.
87. **OLDSWINFORD** For 1851 and 1871 returns see Stourbridge.
88. **ORLETON** see Stanford.
89. **PEBWORTH** Pebworth was transferred from Gloucestershire to Worcestershire in 1931.
90. **PENSHAM** see Pershore St. Andrew.
91. **QUINTON** Quniton was formed in 1841 from Halesowen.
92. **REDMARLEY D'ABITOT** Redmarley D'Abitot was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
93. **REDNAL** Rednal was created in 1957 from Rubery. Try Kings Norton.
94. **RIDGEACRE** Ridgeacre was created a separate civil parish in 1866. Between 1891 and 1901 it was renamed Quinton.
95. **ROCHFORD** Rochford was transferred from Herefordshire to Worcestershire in 1844.
96. **ROMSLEY** Romsley was formed out of Halesowen in 1841.
97. **RUBERY** Rubery was formed from the Lickey in 1933. For 1881 returns see Kings Norton.
98. **ST. MARTIN COUNTY** This refers to the part of Worcester St. Martin's which was not in Worcester County Borough.
99. **ST. PETER THE GREAT COUNTY** This refers to the part of Worcester St. Peter's which was not in Worcester County Borough.
100. **SAINTBURY** Saintbury is in Gloucestershire.
101. **SHIPSTON ON STOUR** Shipston on Stour was transferred from Worcestershire to Warwickshire in 1931.
102. **SHRAWLEY** A transcript of 1851 census returns is on the open shelves at HQ942.44.
103. **SMETHWICK** Smethwick was in Staffordshire and is now in West Midlands.
104. **STAUNTON** Staunton was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
105. **STOKE BLISS** For 1841 returns see Little Kyre.

106. **STOURPORT ON SEVERN** For 1881 returns see Wilden and Upper & Lower Mitton.
107. **STRENSHAM** 1881 also 2 frames in back of handlist.
108. **STUDLEY** Studley is in Warwickshire.
109. **TARDEBIGGE** For returns see x900.4033 BA 9857. See also Tutnal & Cobley.
110. **TEDDINGTON** Teddington was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
111. **TIDMINGTON** Tidmington was transferred from Worcestershire to Gloucestershire in 1931.
112. **TILSOP** Tilsop is in Shropshire.
113. **TREDINGTON** Tredington was transferred from Worcestershire to Warwickshire in 1931.
114. **TUTNALL & COBLEY** see also Tardebigge.
115. **UPPER ARLEY** Upper Arley was transferred for Staffordshire to Worcestershire in 1895.
116. **UPTON** Upton is in Little Hereford, Herefordshire.
117. **WADBOROUGH** see also Drakes Broughton and Wadborough.
118. **WARLEY** Warley Civil Parish was formed in 1884 by the union of Warley Salop and parts of Warley Wigorn, Ridgeacre and Oldbury civil parishes. Warley Salop is that part of Warley which was in Shropshire until 1844.
119. **WARLEY WIGORN** Warley Wigorn is that part of Warley which remained in Worcestershire.
120. **WESTON** Weston is in Shropshire.
121. **WESTON SUB EDGE** Weston Sub Edge is in Gloucestershire.
122. **WHATMORE** Whatmore is in Shropshire.
123. **WHITTON** Whitton is in Shropshire.
124. **WILDEN** Wilden was formed in 1904 from Hartlebury, Kidderminster Foreign and Upper and Lower Mitton.
125. **WILLERSLEY** Willersley is in Gloucestershire.
126. **WOLLASTON** Wollaston was formed in 1860 from Amblecote.
127. **WOLLESCOTE** Wollescote was a separate civil parish from 1866. Wollescote ecclesiastical parish was formed in 1965 from Lye, Stambermill,

Old Swinford and Pedmore. see also Lye.

- 128. WORCESTER** Some of the places listed under Worcester are ecclesiastical parishes. Others are merely areas of the city. Much of the northern part of the city was originally within Claines parish.
- 129. BLOCKHOUSE** see also St. Paul's.
- 130. COLLEGE PRECINCTS** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4415.
- 131. HOLY TRINITY** Holy Trinity was formed in 1866 from Claines and Worcester St. Martin.
- 132. THE TYTHING** see also Claines and Worcester St. Mary
- 133. TOLLADINE** Tolladine was formed in 1952 from St. Barnabas and Holy Trinity.
- 134. ST. ALBANS** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4465031.
- 135. ST. ANDREWS** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4465031.
- 136. ST. BARNABAS** This parish was also referred to as Rainbow Hill. It was formed in 1883 from Claines.
- 137. ST. CLEMENT** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.5565031.
- 138. ST. GEORGE** This parish was also known as Claines St. George. It was formed from Claines in 1862.
- 139. ST. HELEN** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4465031.
- 140. ST. JOHN** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4465031.
- 141. ST. MARK** St. Mark's was formed in 1955 from Worcester.
- 142. ST. MARTIN** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4465031.
- 143. ST. MARY** This parish was also called Worcester, The Tything. It was formed in 1875 from Claines.
- 144. ST. MICHAEL** 1851 transcript on open shelves at Hqq942.4405031.
- 145. ST. NICHOLAS** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4405031.
- 146. ST. PAUL** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4405031. St. Paul's was formed in 1844 from Worcester, St. Peter and the extra parochial district the Blockhouse.
- 147. ST. PETER** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4465031.
- 148. ST. STEPHEN** This parish is also referred to as Barbourne. It was formed in 1862 from Claines
- 149. ST. SWITHUN** 1851 transcript on open shelves at HQq942.4465031.

- 150. WRIBBENHALL** Wribbenhall was formed in 1844 from Kidderminster. For 1861 returns see Kidderminster Foreign.
- 151. WYCHBOLD** Wychbold was formed in 1888 from Dodderhill.
- 152. WYTHALL** The ecclesiastical parish of Wythall was formed in 1758 from Bromsgrove. The civil parish was formed in 1911 from the part of Kings Norton civil parish not transferred to Birmingham.
- 153. YARDLEY** Yardley was transferred from Worcestershire to Birmingham in 1911.
