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
Now that you have finished year 11 it is a great time to get ready for your future courses so that you can be confident when you start your 'A' levels or vocational course. This booklet will give you some information, reading options and work towards your qualifications. It may be that you are thinking about your choice of course or you're not sure about 1 or 2 of your 'A' level options. This booklet will give you the opportunity to learn more about each subject so that you are sure about your choices when you return to education in September. If you have not yet decided on your course, you can look at the information from all of the colleges. This is a great opportunity for you to do some research to make sure that you choose the right course for you. You can try some of the work set and see which subject or course would suit you. If you have not got a firm place remember to have a back-up plan in case you do not get the grades you were expecting, or you do not secure an apprenticeship. Remember to have your CV up to date for any future interviews.

SCHOOL/COLLEGE INFO

If you want to speak to any school, 6th form college or F.E. college you can contact them directly. They will be happy to answer your questions or talk through any concerns that you have. You are still able to enrol on courses, speak to careers advisers and get more information. You will find information on each of the college and 6th form websites. If you have not yet had an interview you will still be able to have an interview if the course has spaces. If you are not sure which course to take the 6th forms and colleges have staff who will be able to advise you.



CAREERS WORCS

If you are undecided on what you want to do contact your school's careers adviser who is available to help you. There is also the Careers Worcestershire helpline. This is a team of qualified advisers from Worcestershire who can help you if you have not secured a place in education, training or an apprenticeship. ADVICE

There are lots of websites available with information to help you if you are not sure what course you want to take in September. The first thing to do is to find out more about you. What do you like and what don't you like? What sort of person are you? What are your strengths and what would you like to improve? Get a piece of paper and write some key words down to help you then take the Buzz Quiz. In under 5 minutes you will find out your strengths and what makes you tick. Then you can look at job profiles on the National Careers Service or Prospects websites. There is lots of information about hundreds of jobs so you can see whether your skills match the jobs. You can find out which course will help you reach your chosen career and what sort of salary you can expect.

For those of you not sure about which A-levels to choose the Uni Guide will help.



If you are in a Worcestershire school which has a 6th form you will be able to speak to your careers adviser or another member of staff, such as your year 11 tutor, head of year 11 or head of 6th form about your options.

The schools that have 6th forms can be found on the Skills4Worcestershire website. These schools have provided work for students to complete for their A level studies starting in September. There are thousands of jobs in the Creative Industries including animators, exhibition designers, lighting technicians, choreographers, film marketing assistants and many many more. It may be that you want to be an accountant but work in a creative environment. The Creative Careers website brings together careers information and opportunities from creative organisations in one directory and enables you to explore careers and opportunities.



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An apprenticeship is a real job, with hands-on experience, a salary and the chance to train while you work gaining valuable workplace skills and experience. You are treated just like all the other employees, with a contract of employment and holiday leave. If you're 16 or over, you can become an apprentice if you spend at least 50% of your working hours in England - for the whole of the apprenticeship and you are not in full-time education.

Worcestershire Apprenticeships support young people in Worcestershire who are looking for Apprenticeships. They can help by providing you with impartial information, advice, guidance and support and they list of all the apprenticeships in Worcestershire which you can find here. There is also the government's apprenticeship website with lots of information and all of the vacancies in England which can be accessed here.

There may not be many live vacancies on the websites now due to the current pandemic as lots of companies have had to furlough their employees. However, the training providers are still recruiting for their courses. They will be able to interview you by telephone. You must also have a back-up plan or plan B if you have not got a place in college or 6th form so you can have a look at the other pages in this booklet and see which courses suit you best by finding more on the college websites, reading about various careers and trying some of the work that has been set.

If you are thinking about an Apprenticeship but are not quite ready for the world of work, then a Traineeship might be just right for you. A Traineeship is an education and training programme with work experience that will help you gain the skills and experience that employers are looking for. It consists of work preparation training, English and Maths for those who need it, and a high-quality work experience placement. Traineeships include work experience placements to help you gain practical experience and skills for the workplace. During the placement you will build up skills to help you secure an apprenticeship or to find full-time employment. At the end of the programme you will get an exit interview and reference from your employer. Traineeships are for young people almost 'work ready' and can last for up to six months.

A Traineeship will put you in a better position to apply for an Apprenticeship or job.

Traineeships in Worcestershire are available with <u>Young Adult Learning</u> who work with training providers and employers across Worcestershire, <u>Nova Training</u>, <u>WCG</u> and <u>Kidderminster College</u>.

T Levels are a brand new 2-year qualification designed by Government to give you a head start towards the career you want and can be done as an alternative to A-levels, Apprenticeships and other Post-16 courses often in a college environment.

T-LEVELS

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

T Levels are backed by leading employers to give you the knowledge and skills for the career you want. They give you the chance to learn what a real career is like while you continue your studies by spending about 80% of your time in the classroom and 20% in a workplace setting on a 45-day placement with an employer.

When you pass your T Level, you will get a nationally recognised certificate showing the overall grade you achieved that can be mapped to UCAS points if needed. It will also give details of what you learned on the course to help you move into skilled employment or even an apprenticeship at a higher level

In the county both Heart of Worcestershire and WCG are offering T Level qualifications through their campuses.
