Romsley

Romsley is a small village 4 miles south of Halesowen, situated in unspoilt countryside with well-preserved woodlands, remnants of ancient hunting forests. The woodlands once provided fuel for the cottage industry of nail-making which were traded with the neighbouring Black Country town of Halesowen. The name Penny Fields comes from the ancient field name of one of the pastures the route passes through.
