To mark Time to Talk Day, the Herefordshire and Worcestershire Wellbeing and Recovery College are putting on a world café event with input from partners and Stamp out Stigma Champions. The aim is to highlight pockets/ layers of hidden stigma and discrimination and to explore the impact that this can have on mental health.

The event will create a safe and supportive space for people to talk, explore the layers of stigma and discrimination; new ways to challenge this; discuss what good support looks like and explore different ways to make positive changes.

Alongside the world café there will be a marketplace of local resources and support organisations where people can gather more information, advice or help with mental health and wellbeing.

Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) training: Reminder of dates available

We wanted to remind and encourage DSL and Deputy DSL's to get their DSL courses booked promptly. Due to the delivery method / style of the trainer we cannot exceed their maximum numbers and to ensure we support schools across the county we encourage booking in advance to avoid disappointment. Aims and objectives:

- For Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSL), designed to **refresh and update** knowledge on the early help and child protection procedures.
- To understand DSL roles and responsibilities
- To understand how and when to make a referral to Family Front Door (FFD)
- To be confident when to share/not share and/or seek advice about information sharing
- To be confident in undertaking an Early Help Assessment

Cost: Free to schools who have purchased the Education Safeguarding Support SLA. If schools have not purchased the Safeguarding Support SLA then the price is £90 + VAT.

Face to face delivery: lunch will be organised in line with the current government guidance at the time of your course, **please ensure any dietary needs are noted at the time of booking**

Virtual delivery: will be via Microsoft teams and joining instructions will be issued along with CPD confirmation.

MHFA Mental Health Awareness Training

Aims and objectives:

- This introductory three-hour session raises awareness of young people's mental health. It aims to enhance knowledge around:
- Some of the common mental health issues affecting young people, including depression, anxiety, eating disorders and psychosis
- Skills to work more effectively with young people living with mental health issues
- Ways to support young people with a mental health issue and relate to their experiences.
