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2 Step Factor Authentication – ACTION REQUIRED

2 step Factor-Authentication has been introduced to Welfare Call login, for **Worcestershire CLA**, to add additional security to help meet IT security requirements. This process will be implemented on **30th June 2022** for all users and so to avoid being locked out of Welfare Call and having to follow a lengthy process of reinstatement, please follow the instructions below to set up your 2 Step Factor-Authentication **NOW.** It only takes 1 minute.

Login to your Welfare Call

Select 'Home' in the bar of options running across the top of the page

Select 'My Account' from the drop down

Choose 'Additional Verification Method (2FA)' from the list on the left-hand side of the screen

Here you will be asked to choose Google Authenticator, Welfare Call One Time Code or Secret Key. **N.B**: Google Authenticator is only useful on a mobile phone or tablet and this type of data entry is usually completed on a PC or Laptop. One Time Code is just that, you would have to go through the process of receiving a new code by email each time you log in. Therefore, **Secret Key** is the Worcestershire Virtual School's recommended option as this



is set by you and so will be relevant every time you log in, just as with your online banking for example.

The criteria for the Secret Key is detailed below:

- 1. Minimal of 8 characters
- 2. Maximum of 100 characters
- 3. Can include Numbers (1234567890)
- 4. Can include Capital Letters (ABCDEFGHIJKLMNOPQRSTUVWXYZ)
- 5. Can include Lower Case Letters (abcdefghijklmnopqrstuvwxyz)
- 6. MUST NOT include punctuation marks or special characters.

Please ensure you do not use anything too obvious, like birth dates, names or addresses.

Please remember that all Progress & Attainment data for all Worcestershire CLA will need to be updated on the e PEP by Wednesday 13th July at the latest. If attainment/progress data has changed (due to you inputting data in an early PEP/PPP this term) please take the time to update this. Worcestershire Children First, in partnership with Public Health, have commissioned a training opportunity with <u>The AIM Project</u>, providing a range of professionals with the opportunity to take part in a free, one day, online training course which looks at increasing awareness and empowering professionals to use transferable skills when working with children and young people who present with HSB.

The training will provide professionals with a theoretical background about the development of sexual behaviour problems, and guidance on what works. It will also consider the impact on adults who are trying to manage a child or young person displaying HSB. The course is designed for a wide range of professionals who support children and young people, such as youth workers, caseworkers, social care and health colleagues.
