Voice of the Child - EYFS

What do we mean by 'the voice of the child'?

Children communicate in many ways, not just verbally. It's the way a child presents themselves, engages in play, finds enjoyment in the setting, seeks comfort and experiences the world around them. In tuning in to the child's voice, we get a sense of a child's personality, interests, preferences and feelings. Understanding how we can hear the child's voice helps us to empower children to communicate and represent their emotions.

Early Childhood Maths Group

Early Childhood Maths Group toolkit on spatial reasoning, 0-7yrs.

The Early Childhood Maths Group (ECMG) have produced a new toolkit on spatial reasoning, in collaboration with researchers at the University of Surrey.

'Spatial reasoning' (also referred to as 'spatial thinking' or 'spatial awareness') involves how we understand location (where things are positioned and where they are in relation to other things), dimensions (for example, how long something is or how big something is and the properties of objects (such as spiky or flat).

This guidance aims to clarify the mathematics in early spatial experiences such as these, suggesting what to emphasise in order to support the development of children's spatial reasoning in sensitive, appropriate and playful ways.

The toolkit is aimed at supporting practitioners with spatial reasoning, as in the new EYFS Mathematical Educational Programme. The toolkit includes videos and posters, as well as a learning trajectory for children from birth to 7. You can view it **here**.
