Aims/Objectives:	Fulfil statutory requirements; Provide a mechanism for parents and carers to register their child's disability with the Council; To add to the Council's Local Offer; To contribute to data which the Council uses to predict service need and shape support.
Intended outcomes:	Where a child or young person has a disability their Parent or Carer will be able independently to register that disability, if they wish to do so.
Please summarise how these outcomes will be achieved?	The Council is developing an online registration form for parents/carers to complete on behalf of a child who has a disability. The Council will record the details and issue confirmation of registration. Professionals working with families will make them aware of the registration process and, where support is needed, assist adult carers to complete the process.

This will be used to understand more about the parent carers who would be completing the register for their children. It will also add to the data we receive from the register to have a better understanding of the needs of children and young people with SEND, and their families, in Worcestershire.
