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PUBLIC HEALTH EVIDENCE SEARCH STRATEGY	
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ABOUT THIS SEARCH STRATEGY/INTRODUCTION

This search strategy can be used to help guide and document data and evidence searches for specific projects. It is not intended to be over-prescriptive or to be worked through systematically if some sections are not relevant.

Each website/resource listed will have different rules and methods for conducting a search and the 'Help' section of the website can be consulted for guidance on this.

Using the columns for date, search terms and notes helps to document a search for later reference and write up. It may also be useful to collate what you find in a spreadsheet.

Five steps have been suggested for basing policy and practice on evidence:

- 1. Asking answerable questions i.e. formulating questions into a format whereby you can interrogate the literature
- 2. Searching for the evidence if you can find a pre-appraised resource, you can miss out the next step
- 3. Critically appraising what you find (not always necessary see above)
- 4. Deciding what action to take from your findings
- 5. Evaluating your new or amended recommendation for policy or practice.

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Strategic Health Asset Planning And Evaluation (SHAPE)

Mapping application which supports the strategic planning of services and physical assets across a whole health economy. Indicators currently contained in SHAPE include:

- Demographic data such as age structure, ethnicity and deprivation;
- Public health data such as mortality, screening, childhood obesity and lifestyle indicators;
- Primary care indicators including: Flu immunisation, GP survey satisfaction, units of dental activity and QoF scores;
- Estate performance indicators such as age profile of buildings and costs associated with occupancy and maintenance.

SHAPE is free to NHS professionals and Local Authority professionals with a role in Public Health or Social Care. Access to the application is by formal registration and licence agreement.


