1	Welcome and Introductions: Bernie welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made
2	Actions from the previous meeting:
	<b>ACTION:</b> Adult Autism Support Service - Hilary to attend the next Autism Partnership Board Meeting to give more information on the above service and link into the social work teams to update the teams on the new service – on Agenda
	<b>ACTION:</b> Post Diagnostic Support Pilot for 14-18 year olds - Richard Keble to speak to a CCG colleague about providing a statement on where social care can direct people back to who are enquiring about these services – carry over to next meeting
	<b>ACTION</b> : Autism Strategy update - Group to feedback ideas on how best to engage with autistic people – please feedback ideas to <u>AutismGroups@worcestershire.gov.uk</u> – carry over to next meeting

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3	Suicide Prevention - Louise McEvoy, Sue Pritchard, Public Health

	Louise and Sue went through their presentation.
	ACTION: Slides to be shared with the minutes
	Questions/Comments:
	Q: Are there any accurate figures (in relation to suicide) for those on the Autistic Spectrum?
	A: Not at the moment – still negotiating with the Coroner about what can and can't be collected
	Q: Can we make sure we consider all the people who don't get a formal diagnosis and are not receiving support
	A: Whatever the Coroner releases in terms of data, if the family wanted to provide some additional data, it could be inputted afterwards to
	give us a bigger picture. Public Health looking to set up a group to look at the real-time information
	ACTION: Sue P to draft an email to go round to APB Members asking for people to attend the group and to feedback any information
	Q: Lockdown had an enormous effect on everyone, especially those with Autism, and the figures state that people with Autism are 9 times more like to commit suicide – are they any figures regarding the number of deaths during lockdown?
	A: A new data set is due in September which may include numbers from 2020 and 2019. From the other real time data sets, it doesn't show a rise in suicide.
	Q: There is clearly a link between the number of people self-harming and the links to suicide. Are there links to peer support?
	A: Not sure at this stage - part of the project is to bring in agencies to provide that support and that is one of the actions in the Action
	Plan. There are some voluntary groups that have been set up to provide peer support. There are national programmes in schools and for

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	those not attending schools. Trying to source support for the parents as well as the children. It is something we are looking at but it is not in place at the moment.
	C: A large population of autistic children are out of school and have no ECHP, for autistic children there are no right strategies and lack of services – it is reassuring to know that Public Health are sourcing support for parents. The real time information will be good to look at the near misses and where the support came from.
	Q: There is nothing in the vulnerable groups about LGBTQ group and lots of people on the spectrum are part of that group. A: LGBTQ will be included as one of the groups but wasn't picked up in the Task & Finish Group. It will be included in the strategy going forward.
	Q: Is the funding available yet?
	A: Not yet – can provide an update when it is available which will be towards the end of the year.
4	Autism Support Service – Hilary McGlynn, Autism West Midlands
	Hilary went through her presentation.
	ACTION: Slides to be shared with the minutes
	Questions/Comments:
	Q: How do we get in touch and where are you?
	A: It is a soft launch at the moment and not widely advertised. There is an email contact on the website. Any queries, drop Hilary an email.
	Q: We haven't seen the spec, there was engagement and we as a Partnership Board said what we wanted. It would be a good idea for the spec to be shared by the Commissioner. Support seems to be focussed around understanding your diagnosis.

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	A: It is all encompassing – will be signposting to other services – in the first year, it will be around diagnosis and what it means to the person.
	ACTION: Can the spec for the service be shared with the Board – Richard Keble
	Q: How do I access services that should be open to me?
	A: We will help with this, the referral form can be completed or a call can be made.
	Q: It is very disappointing that support is online – people want face to face A: There is a need for online support and there are some people who are never going to cope with face-to-face or need online support as a bridge to face-to-face. It is not always going to be online. The team are locally based and will be delivering services on the ground. Bringing people together online will be the most practical way to start with.
	Q: Pleased to know that more practical advice is being offered A: There is a tick-list on the referral form – there is a great need for autistic adults to have that support. Not just about practical support, both go hand in hand
	<ul> <li>Q: One of the exclusion criterion is those with EHCPs. We need to make sure that those with EHCPs can access the service.</li> <li>A: We are going to be as flexible as we can and look at on an individual basis. The tricky one will be Social Care – have had a chat with the team that are diagnosing people with LD And ASD. Happy to flag up things as they arise.</li> </ul>
	Mel fedback that they have started some work on annual reviews and is meeting with health colleagues and commissioners and looking at systems to ensure that they get social care advice. Have started reviewing the EOTAS (education other than at school) packages and have started to draft the practice guidance. These areas will be picked up as part of the children and young people workstream. Mel will be happy to feedback to the group.
