Thank you for including us in the consultation. I have just submitted a formal 'comment' on this proposal.

We do not object, as there are no designated sites involved, however we do request access during the extraction process for investigation/research purposes.

We have also recommended an information board explaining the geology of the site, which is adjacent to a lower terrace and also includes a small amount of glacial deposit on the hill to the east. The site is close to the town, and restoration plans involve substantial increase in public access combined with education initiatives.

Plans for an information board would add impetus to the request for access and support from the developers in obtaining information of geological interest, which would be used in the information board and provide positive publicity for the developers if they are shown to have helped.
