Whilst I appreciate that BS 5837:2012 will be adhered to in this case, I wanted to clarify that the buffer zone for T22 would be in line with recommendations for veteran trees specifically, i.e. RPA at least 15 times the diameter of the stem, or 5m beyond the canopy edge (whichever is greatest).
