Description of development: Proposed sand and gravel quarry with progressive restoration using site derived and imported inert material to agricultural parkland, public access and nature enhancement

Location: Land at Lea Castle Farm, Wolverley Road, Broadwaters, Kidderminster, Worcestershire

Comments I previously provided formal comments on this scheme on 27th February 2020. The applicant has since then submitted further information in the form of Appendix I: Historic Environment.

My original comments stand, with the exception of the comments on noise, dust and other environmental conditions.

Staffordshire and Worcestershire Canal Conservation Area

In respect of the above, I previously commented as follows:

"I am concerned [however] that the nature of the proposed development may create noise, dust or other environmental conditions which have a harmful impact on the intrinsic character of the [Staffordshire and Worcestershire] Canal Conservation Area as experienced by those within it. At this location the Area runs through a particularly tranquil setting, quite different from the industrial and urban landscapes of Stourport and Kidderminster and this is noted in the Conservation Area Appraisal.

The impact of potential noise, dust or other environmental conditions affecting species or flora and fauna within the Conservation Area should be considered by the relevant consultees".

I am not qualified to assess the noise and dust and other environmental conditions and thus, provided there are no objections from those relevant consultees qualified to comment on these matters, I have no objections.
