Reason(s) For Decision	As set out in the published report. The overall purpose of the Section 75 agreement is to formalise partnership arrangements designed to jointly improve outcomes for patients and service users. Worcestershire has a history of joint commissioning across Adults' and Children's Services. Section 75 of the NHS Act 2006 empowers the NHS and Councils to enter into formal agreements. The Council needs to renew its Section 75 partnership arrangements with Health for the Commissioning of Services for 2015/16, and it is expedient to do so through delegated decision-making.
