

Rainbow @ St Mary's School 12 on-line responses 13 other responses	Concerns raised: On-line responses all in support of the services currently delivered from this centre. St Mary's School submitted a detailed objection to the proposals and their own proposals for the use of the area of the building currently used by 10:32 including use of the space for family support, professional meetings, stay and play sessions, before and after school provision and family learning.	There is a 46% deficit of available hours within this ward. The current early years provider is rated by Ofsted as Good and meets the national requirements to offer funded hours for 2, 3 & 4 year old children. St Mary's School also offer funded places for 3 & 4 year olds, along with some 2 year old children, however they currently do not meet the national requirements to offer two year old funded places as they are judged by Ofsted as Requires Improvement. It is likely that in the future their continued presence on the Worcestershire Directory of Funded Providers for two year old funding will be questioned.	Health services including Health Visitor Clinics and Ante-natal Clinics can continue at this centre under these proposals as the centre will be made available for two days a week for health, parenting/family support and community use. In response to the large number of responses supporting universal activity sessions, a sum of £30k (county-wide) has been identified to support this provision to become self-sustaining. Under these proposals the centre will be utilised throughout the year and will provide full time childcare of value to working parents. Universal and targeted support will also continue to be available to families through both the Parenting and Family Support provider and the 0-19 public health nursing service, either in the family home or at this (two days per week) or other community venues as appropriate. Due to the quality and reputation of Franche First School, their catchment of children in much wider than the Franche & Habberley North ward and therefore they relieve pressure on their neighbouring wards	Under these proposals a mix of provision including health services (health and ante-natal clinics), childcare provision and an after school club will be delivered at this centre. In response to the large number of responses supporting universal activity sessions, a sum of £30k (county-wide) has been identified to support this provision to become self-sustaining. Universal and targeted support will also continue to be available to families through both the Parenting and Family Support provider and the 0-19 public health nursing service, either in the family home or at other community venues as appropriate. In response to the concerns regarding schools running these buildings, a recommendation is being made to initiate a 6-9 month transition period to provide assurance that buildings are being managed appropriately. In addition to this, the lease agreement will also specify the need to participate in an annual review. Concerns expressed regarding the loss of stay and play sessions and health provision	nursery provision (if applicable) There is a significant deficit in available hours within this ward, which means that an increase in early years provision would be beneficial for early years sufficiency. The school is rated by Ofsted as Requires Improvement so they may not be able to offer two year old funded provision through their own registration. (NB the current childcare provider holds a separate lease for part of the building)	Under these proposals a mix of provision including health services (health and ante-natal clinics), childcare provision, some universal activity sessions, parenting support and family/adult learning will continue to be delivered at this centre. The centre is a two storey, multi room facility which is currently under-utilised. Universal and targeted support will also continue to be available to families through both the Parenting and Family Support provider and the 0-19 public health nursing service, in the family home, at this centre or at other community venues
			as appropriate. A recommendation is being made to initiate a 6-9 month transition period to provide assurance that buildings are being managed appropriately and in the case of this centre this will ensure that the use of the building increases, including for additional childcare places.
