Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disabilities and Autism



The Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training on Learning Disability and Autism is named after Oliver McGowan.

Oliver's story and death showed the need for health and social care staff to have a better understanding about learning disability and Autism.



Training will start to be delivered across Herefordshire and Worcestershire in the next couple of months.



All levels of the training must be delivered by a Co-Trainer with a learning disability, an Autistic Co-Trainer and a subject matter expert Trainer.

SpeakEasy N.O.W. will be employing and supporting people with learning disabilities to be Co-Trainers.



To start with we will have a group of Co-Trainers who will be delivering the training.

We hope that once the training sessions increase and we know more about funding we will be able to have more people with learning disabilities be Co-Trainers as a regular part time job.



We attended a National Train the Trainer session on 9th January so we can help to train the other Co-Trainers.



People's Parliament

Dental Survey
