Reach Out by Split Second

Split Second are made up of 15 and 16-year-olds from across the county who have teamed up with the NHS Trust who are the main provider of mental health services across both counties.

Janice has been a Foster Carer for over 32 years and have dedicated so much time and love to many children in care. Despite the diverse range of ages, backgrounds and challenges, Janice dedicated her life to ensure that every foster child has received the same loving and nurturing environment as her own children.

Janice Finnie said: "I have been overwhelmed and emotional at winning the Foster Talk - Foster Carer of the Year award 2022. This award, given the very high standard of other candidates, was a total shock. I have always viewed being a foster carer a privilege and an honour. The children we have supported have included a variety of ages, cultures and backgrounds, including children with medical conditions and learning difficulties.
