PROPOSED PRECEPT

In accordance with Schedule 5 to the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011, I write to confirm that the West Mercia Police and Crime Panel reviewed your proposed precept on 7 February 2019 in a public meeting at County Hall, Worcester. Thank you for attending and answering questions.

As required in the Act the Panel must formally make a report to you as Commissioner on your proposed precept; please accept this letter as the formal report of the Panel.

The precept proposal you recommended to the Panel was to increase the precept by 9.94% for 2019/20, adding £19.59 to the annual Council Tax bill for a typical band D home.

The Panel also considered the report of the Budget Task Group. The Panel made the following comments arising from the Task Group report:

- While concerned at the apparent high percentage increase, the Panel was unanimous in its decision to approve both the precept for 2019/20 and the Medium Term Financial Plan 2019/22 as presented to the meeting;
- A key feature of the reason for the increase in precept is the recruitment of 115 new Police Officers and a particular concern to the Panel was the rate at which these could be recruited and the subsequent delay in them becoming operational;
- Additionally, the Panel accepted the proposal from the same Task Group authorising it to revisit the budget with the PCC later in the 2019/20 financial year to review the impact and effectiveness of the spending proposals. This will include the £200k investment in the Victim Advice Line; recruitment to the additional posts both of Police Officers generally and the additional posts for Rural and Business crime officers as well as an update on the Athena project.
