Duty of Care

This is your responsibility to take reasonable care not to hurt other people or yourself

THE EMPLOYER



Provide safe tools



Provide a safe method of dealing with dangerous substances



Provide information about safety rules





Provide a safe and healthy place to work



Provide a safe and healthy atmosphere - light, ventilation and temperature



Provide a written safety policy



Consult with trade union safety representatives



Form a safety committee if requested to do so by two or more safety representatives



The employer cannot charge the employee for any of the health or safety measures



Provide safe work clothing and equipment



THE EMPLOYEE



Take care that their actions do not hurt themselves or others



Cooperate with the employer and not alter the safety conditions - for example, remove a safety guard so that they can do things more easily or quickly.
