Having a Place to Live

Having a Place to Live

Sam talked through the Highlight Report.

Fran talked about the importance of the Safe Places Scheme and said this will link into the new Strategy.

Cat said there is a directory on the Our Way website where you can see all the shops and businesses in the County with the Safe Places sticker in the window.

Fran to meet with Cat and Caroline to link the Safe Places scheme in with the Strategy.

Gail referred to the problems/risks section of the Report where it was raised that healthy eating and living was still a big issue for people with learning disabilities and that Support Workers need to do more. Gail said many people choose to lead unhealthy lives and it is unrealistic to blame Support Workers for this, it is about educating people with learning disabilities to lead healthier lives.

Martin agreed with Gail and said this issue is raised often in meetings he attends. Martin said it is about empowering people to understand the importance of healthy living and making sure Support Workers have the proper training to ask questions in the right way to promote and support eating healthily and exercising.

Adam said in the new Supported Living Specification he has included healthy living into the document, for example having healthy living champions in teams and at the next meeting he will share more information about this.

Right Support for Carers

Kate went through the Highlight Report.

Martin gave feedback about the Adult Front Door presentation. He said some carers were unclear what the difference was from Adult Front Door and Family Front Door and there was a lack of understanding about the targets that are being set. Carers also wanted to have more information about the targets that were included in the presentation. As more information was needed it was suggested that Nicki Breakwell could be invited to attend the next Carers Partnership Board to answer questions.

As a Board is this something we would like to follow up?
The Adult Front Door have been out to expert by
experience meetings and overall, not very impressed, a lot
of people with learning disabilities do not have internet
access so therefore would be unable to use this service.

Morag met with the team to talk about making meetings accessible, but it was felt that this would be difficult to do. Accessibility was a big issue raised. Concerns of the lack of awareness and understanding by the Adult Front Door team of how to make things accessible.

Staying Healthy

Item:



Online Banking Project

Matt is a Link Worker for West Midlands Forum, and he came to the Board to talk about online banking and if it is accessible for people with learning disabilities. Matt asked the group if they knew about scam calls. Matt talked about the safety of online banking. Matt explained that if people do online banking they must think about security and keeping money safe by changing log in information regularly.

Fran asked whether the project is to teach and educate people or to work with banks.

Matt said the team are going into banks to talk about the project. Matt said some banks have attended different groups to explain to people how to online bank.

Gail said it was interesting to hear this as Phil from West Midlands Forum and some members of the Police will be coming to a Speakeasy meeting in November to talk more about online banking.

Item:

Terms of Reference



Fran went through the updated Terms of Reference.

Fran explained that not every theme has a sub-group so there will be different ways in how the work is done.

Fran talked about the strategy aims that do not have a sub-group. Fran suggested that we may decide to have a Board meeting that focuses on a specific theme to gain updates as the themes that have sub-groups will provide Highlight Reports.

The Board signed off the Terms of Reference



Comments/Questions:

Chris would like to start the Having a Job sub-group again, but membership of the group has been a problem in the past, so this would need to be looked at if the group was to work properly.

Martin said some people would be unable to gain paid employment so is it more about having a meaningful day.

Pam said it is about having a purposeful and meaningful day.

Sam explained that there are people that want to work but don't because they are worried about losing their benefits. There are also some people who do not want to work.

Fran said that this discussion fits well into the strategy theme of Purposeful Days.

Worcestershire Learning Disability Strategy

Fran asked the Board to continue sharing the Strategy to get more publicity for it. Fran asked if Chris could add this to their website too.

Chris said he is going to put the strategy as a separate tab on the website so that more people can access it.

Summary version is being worked on and this is almost ready to launch. Fran met with Experts by Experience to listen to comments and additions.

Front page needs to be the same as the strategy, Chris is going to add the front page to the summary version.

The Board went through the Year One Action Plan and decided who is leading on each action.



Any Other Business

Item:

Following the presentation from Liss Wood at the previous Board, Martin raised a concern from carers, who have asked about Quality Assurance of services and the role of Quality Checkers, and how this will be done in the future. They feel that the Quality Checkers bring a different dynamic due to their experience.

Fran said this had been discussed at the last meeting, as Speakeasy NOW will be taking more of a role as part of the Having a Voice contract, to ensure people with lived experience are involved in checking services.
