

What is a traineeship?

A traineeship is a skills development programme that includes an unpaid work placement. It can last from 6 weeks up to 1 year (although most will last for less than 6 months).

Traineeships help 16 to 24 year olds - or 25 year olds with an education, health and care (EHC) plan - get ready for an apprenticeship or job if they don't have the appropriate skills or experience.

Who are they for?

They are aimed at young people who:

- > aren't currently in a job and have little work experience, but who are focused on work or the prospect of it;
 - are 16-24 and are qualified below a full Level 3 qualification
- > providers and employers believe have a reasonable chance of being ready for employment or an
- > apprenticeship within six months of engaging in a Traineeship.
