



What is an apprenticeship?

An Apprenticeship is a type of job you can get from the age of 16 where you work full-time for a company but are also trained at the same time. You earn a salary and are treated like an employee, but you will spend time training, learning hands-on skills you'll need to progress in your chosen career. There are various levels of apprenticeships available, with level 7 being the highest.







Almost all apprenticeships can be made accessible and having additional needs shouldn't restrict people's employment opportunities.

- > Inclusive apprenticeships are flexible, bespoke programmes designed for those with additional learning needs and disabilities.
- To support learners there are a number of adjustments that can be made. For example, learners will be supported by a mentor, the length of apprenticeships can be extended and adjustments can be made to entry requirements.
