Hadzor and Droitwich Spa

Droitwich Spa is situated in the heart of Worcestershire. The town grew from the availability of salt, in fact in Roman times the town was known as Salinae. The brine water found here is so salty only the Dead Sea can equal it in strength and density from a natural source. Hadzor is situated one mile to the east of Droitwich Spa and is bound on the north and eastern sides of the parish by two canals; the Droitwich Junction Canal and Worcester Birmingham Canal. Hadzor is a small picturesque village, which in 1533 Henry VIII gave to Catherine of Aragon as part of their divorce settlement.
