On 24TH April 2025, Worcestershire County Council confirmed the above order made under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980, and Section 53A(2) of the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the footpath and modify the definitive map and statement for Worcestershire, accordingly.

From: a line running from Ordnance Survey Grid Reference (OSGR) SO 9141 5303 (Point A on the Order map), in a south-south-easterly direction for 28 metres, then turns in a south-westerly direction for 32 metres to terminate at OSGR SO 9140 5298 (Point B on the Order map). To: a line running from (OSGR) SO 9141 5303 (Point A on the Order map) with a minimum width of 2 meters proceeding in a south-westerly direction for 42 metres to terminate at the highway U43003 Edwards Lane at OSGR SO 9138 5300 (Point C on the Order map). The order comes into force as from 24th April 2025 but if any person aggrieved by the order wants to question its validity, or that of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made under the Act, has not been complied with in relation to the order, he or she may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 6 to the Act, within 6 weeks from the date of the notice make an application to the High Court.
